



The Louisiana Annual Conference Board of Ordained Ministry offers scholarships to degree-seeking students. Scholarships are based on both merit and need, and are primarily designated for full-time study; however, the Verrett Scholarship is available for students enrolled part-time, as well as persons pursuing course of study.

All awards are based on materials submitted, and are awarded only for the current academic year or semester.

AWARDS ARE NON-RECURRING.

AN APPLICATION IS REQUIRED EACH YEAR.

CERTIFIED CANDIDATES FOR ORDAINED MINISTRY ARE GIVEN PRIORITY CONSIDERATION.

Stated amounts are subject to availability. All funds are managed by the United Methodist Foundation of Louisiana. Completed applications should be submitted by **FEBRUARY 1, 2008**. Mail to Rev. Van A. Stinson at the address listed in this brochure. Award recipients will be notified prior to **JUNE 1, 2008**.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Bonnie Ruth Holley Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship, established with proceeds from the estate of Reverend Holley, is awarded to a person who shows promise for ordained ministry and can clearly articulate vocational goals in service to the church. \$2500 scholarship awarded annually.

Charlotte Brent Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship, established by Wilson Brent to honor his wife, provides one \$1000 scholarship to a woman beginning a second career as an ordained minister, who is attending a United Methodist seminary.

Eleanor Hurley Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship, established in 2000 by an Acadiana District member, is awarded solely to a Louisiana resident who is enrolled as a full-time ministerial student at any one of the following four seminaries: Perkins, St. Paul, Yale, or Union. Two \$1500 scholarships awarded annually.

Jones Davis Scholarship

These scholarships, established in 2003 with a gift from the Jones Davis Foundation of Baton Rouge, are awarded to theological students who can clearly articulate vocational goals in service to the church. Two \$2000 scholarships awarded annually.

Nanette Kirby Memorial Scholarship

These scholarships, established in 2000, are awarded to graduate/professional degree-seeking students, or to undergraduate degree-seeking students who plan on entering seminary and can clearly articulate vocational goals in service to the church. Two \$1000 scholarships awarded annually.

Sherman Scholarship Fund

Established in 1982 by Jane Sherman as a memorial to her husband, Rev. George Sherman, to educate persons intending to enter ordained ministry. One \$1000 scholarship awarded annually.

Trice Ministerial Scholarship

This scholarship, established in 1983 as a memorial to Dr. W.E. Trice by a member of University United Methodist Church in Baton Rouge, is awarded to graduate/professional degree-seeking students who have exceptional promise for ordained ministry and can clearly articulate vocational goals in service to the church. Preference given to students involved in the Wesley Foundation at LSU. One \$800 scholarship awarded annually.

Verrett Scholarship

Established in 1989, these grants are for Louisiana seminary students. Five \$500 scholarship grants awarded annually. This scholarship is primarily for students pursuing part-time study, but is also available to persons pursuing course of study.

Only one application is required. Applicants will be considered for all eligible scholarships. Only one scholarship will be awarded to a selected recipient.
